Leg Ulcers	Arterial	Venous
Signs/	Pulses are absent or	Pulses palpable
Symptoms	diminished	Dry thin skin
	<ol><li>Skin is shiny &amp; thin</li></ol>	<ol><li>Achy or heavy feeling in</li></ol>
	<ol><li>Pain on elevation</li></ol>	extremity; worse after standing
	4. Little to no exudates: dry lesion	Pain, ache or heavy feeling
	<ol><li>Wound margins are even</li></ol>	relieved by elevation of extremity
	<ol><li>Lift the extremity and it</li></ol>	Moderate to heavy exudates
	becomes pale	(weeping)
	Lack of hair on feet and ankles	<ol><li>Irregular wound margins</li></ol>
	Thickened toenails	<ol><li>Leg hyper-pigmentation</li></ol>
	Decreased temperature	Almost always lower extremity
	Punched out appearance = ulcers	Shallow
	(circles)	Firm Edema
	Gangrene or necrosis	Varicose veins
	Wound bed is pale	
Treatment	Increase blood flow	Decrease venous pressure
	Optimize local wound	Decrease edema
	environment	Decrease pooling of blood: keep
	Debridement	extremities elevated
	Prevent infection	Compression Therapy
